ZONING ARTICLES

Article 02: Zoning

Are you in favor of the adoption of the following amendments as proposed by the Planning Board for the **Greenland Zoning Ordinance?**

Create new Article XXVIII - Residential-Commercial-Industrial Mixed us (RCIM) Overlay District: This district is designed as an overlay district that permits residential, commercial and/or industrial uses on a parcel(s). The Planning Board shall have the authority to grant Conditional Use Permits within the provisions outlined in this Ordinance. The District includes options which enable and encourage greater flexibility in the design of residential housing along with non-residential uses. The RCIM District permits development of land, based upon a site development master plan which allows flexibility in internal road design, reduced dwelling lot sizes, density and modified dimensional requirements. The District would include all lands currently zoned Commercial Business (CB) Alden Avenue, Commercial Corridor Highway (CC) and Industrial. Also, amend Article II, Definitions, by deleting the definition of Mix-use Development and Article III, Establishment of Districts and Uses, Table 3.6, Section A Residential Uses, by deleting number 10, Mixed-use Development as a use group.

Article 03: Zoning

Are you in favor of the adoption of the following amendments as proposed by the Planning Board for the Greenland Zoning Ordinance?

Amend Article III, Establishment of Districts and Uses, Section 3.6 Table of Uses, by creating a new use group, O. Residential-Commercial-Industrial Mixed Use District (RCIM), by allowing RCIM uses within a portion of the community along the Route 1 corridor zoned Commercial A and Residential including properties identified on Tax Map R1 as Lots 5, 6, 7, 9, 9A and 9B. RCIM requirements are set forth in Article 2 and if approved would establish a Conditional Use Permit process to allow for a variety of uses to be allowed. Any use proposed within this District shall be required to undertake a hydrological study to evaluate groundwater conditions as directed by the Planning

Article 04: Zoning

Are you in favor of the adoption of the following amendments as proposed by the Planning Board for the **Greenland Zoning Ordinance?**

Amend Article II Definitions, by adding the following: Off-site Parking Lot – A parking lot located greater than 500 feet from a place of business used to park vehicles associated with the place of business. In addition, amend Table 3.6 Table of Uses, Section L, Motor Vehicle by adding Off-site Parking Lot as an allowed use by Conditional Use Permit (CUP) in the following Zoning Districts: CA Existing Commercial, CB Alden Ave, CC Highway and I Industrial. Also, adding a new Section 3.6.3 A. Conditional Use Permit Off-site Parking Lot, Standards of Review: Following a fully noticed public hearing on the proposed use, the Planning Board may issue a Conditional Use Permit if it finds, based on the information and testimony submitted with respect to the CUP application, that:

- 1. The Applicant has demonstrated, to the satisfaction of the Planning Board, that the proposed parking lot is necessary to temporarily support (90 days maximum) the business to address a parking capacity need created by market conditions or special events.
- 2. The site is appropriate for the proposed Off-site Parking Lot, meeting all appropriate site plan review provisions.
- 3. In no case shall a business located outside the boundaries of Greenland be allowed to obtain approval for an Off-site Parking Lot.
- 4. If an Applicant can demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the Planning Board, that the Off-site Parking Lot is critical to the successful function of the local business, than the 90 day maximum period may be extended on a case by case basis.
